## **Adjustment of Tuition Fees**

## Valid from the academic year 2025/26

From the 2025/26 academic year onwards, there will be an <u>initial increase</u> in tuition fees, which have remained unchanged since 2004:

The tuition fee will be increased from €363.36 or €726.72 to €450 or €900.

Introduction of a dual degree fee:

- Students enrolled in two or more degree programmes with **the same major artistic subject** (e.g. BA and MA in the same instrument) will be required to pay an additional **surcharge of €150** on top of the single tuition fee of €450 or €900.
- If you are studying two or more programmes with **different major artistic subjects**, you must pay the full tuition fee **for each programme**.

An increase in tuition fees for students exceeding the standard period of study plus two tolerance semesters: From the third exceeding semester onwards, an increased fee of €675 or €1,350 per degree programme is to be paid.

Introduction of a **graduation bonus**: Students who successfully complete their degree within the standard period of study will receive a refund of the last regular semester's tuition as a bonus. This means that over the entire Bachelor's degree programme, a student only pays about 8% more (previously  $\leq 2,906.88$ , now  $\leq 3,150.00$ ), while the Master's degree will cost even less (previously  $\leq 1,453.44$ , now  $\leq 1,350$ ).

Thanks to the financial support of the **Federal State of Upper Austria**, which currently contributes **an average of more than €26,000 per student every academic year**, the tuition fees at the Anton Bruckner University are considerably lower than at comparable international institutions. There are also many possibilities for financing ones' studies through scholarships and grants.



From the 2025/26 academic year onwards, there will also be an **adjustment to the registration fees**: the post-enrolment contribution will be increased from €50 to €100. When resuming studies after de-registration, all paused semesters (up to a maximum of 4) will be charged including the late-enrolment fee.
